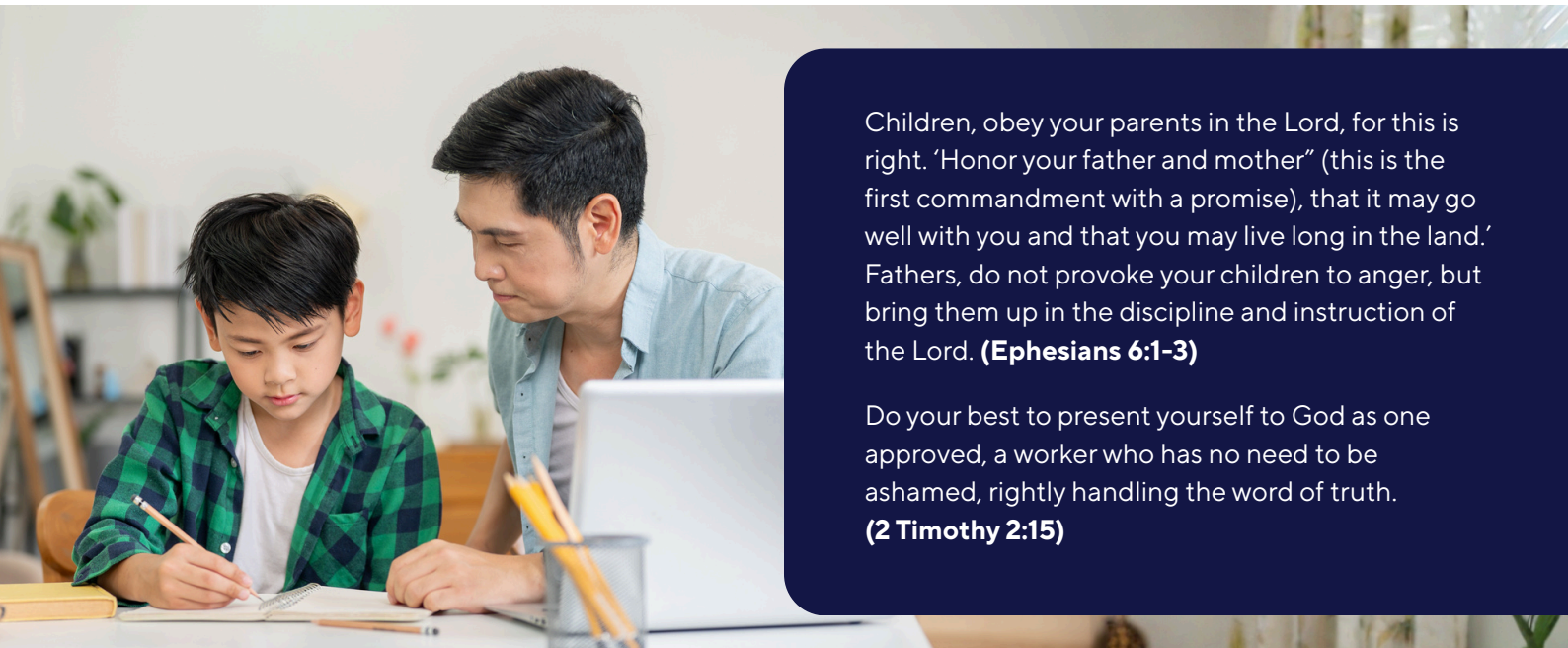

DESIGN TECH

If you answered D, congratulations.

Design Tech is about helping students think clearly, solve real problems, and create with purpose.

This month I want to take some time to write about how I develop and work through projects in Design Tech.

My priority with any project is to consider if it is appropriate for the age group. Then I think about how it will help students grow. From there, I consider how students could solve the problem and whether there are multiple solutions.

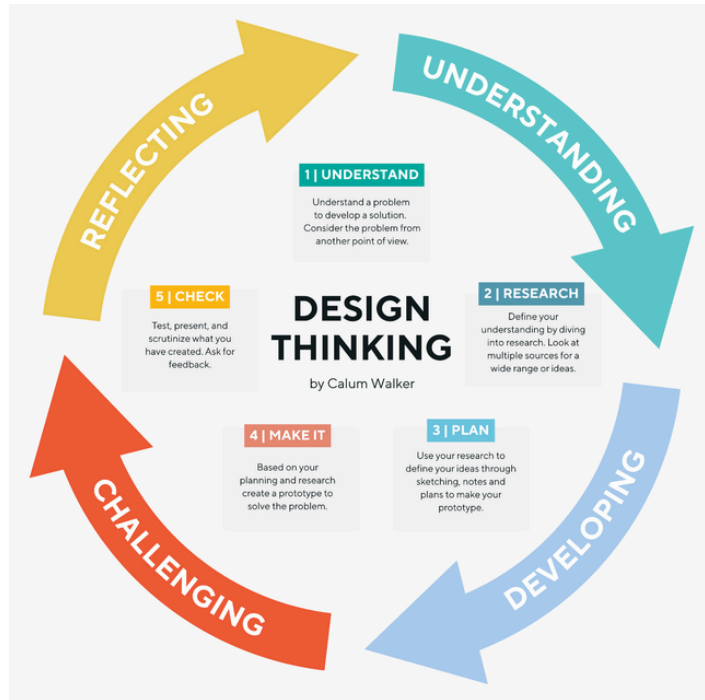
If a project is age-appropriate, helps students grow, and can be approached in multiple ways, then I will develop it further. If the project is not realistic, not relatable, or only has one solution, I will normally leave it on the cutting room floor.

Similar to assignments given in university, I set students a "brief" from a client that outlines what is expected. It is clear enough to understand the goal, but requires careful reading to fully grasp. It is a deep hope of mine that as students read and develop problem-solving skills by meeting the client's needs, they become stronger at supporting themselves and others through systematic thinking

.For example, students might design a product, system, or solution based on a real-world need.

- D) Purposeful problem solving

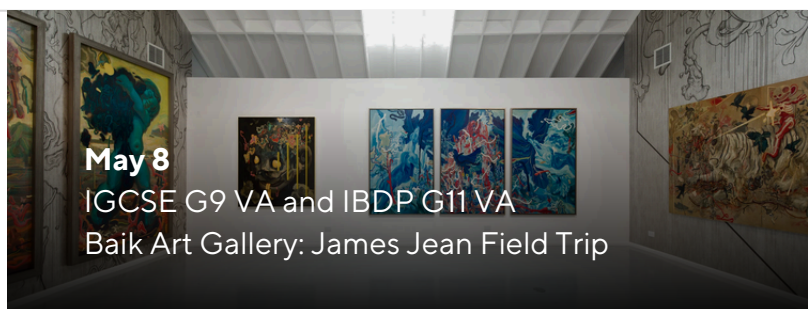
From there, students develop research, mind maps, vision boards, specification lists, and final drafts, all before starting to create their prototype. My goal is for students to finish most of their written work in the first 2-3 weeks (4-6 classes), so they have more time to create.

Sometimes people are surprised that I give a full term for each project, but it is the secret to making Design Tech meaningful. As adults, we are used to working towards deadlines, finishing work early, reviewing it, and improving it. These are lifelong skills that students need to develop as well. Ten weeks gives students time to fail, reflect, and improve, turning failure into success.


